Research Poster Judging Criteria

Each section will be rated on a scale from 0-5 (a score of 5 being excellent) with a maximum total score of 70 points.

1. Quality of the Visual Presentation

- Readability (neat, not crowded) – up to 5 points
- Flow (panel arrangement and layout are logical) – up to 5 points
- Visual Impact (draws attention, appeal) – up to 5 points

2. Sound Conceptual Framework

- Is the hypothesis clear and reasonable? – up to 5 points
- Are objectives clearly stated? – up to 5 points
- Is the study based on a theoretical framework? – up to 5 points
- Is the methodology appropriate for type of study and sample size? – up to 5 points
- Are results clearly stated? – up to 5 points
- Are conclusions reasonable and substantiated? – up to 5 points
- Are implications of findings stated? – up to 5 points

3. Relevance to Cancer Education / Theme of Conference

- Does the conclusion relate back to a key problem in cancer education? – up to 5 points
- Will the results make a difference or have an impact on the cancer community (Patients, Practitioners and the Public)? – up to 5 points

4. Usefulness

- Can the research be applied elsewhere? – up to 5 points

5. Responses to Questions, Depth and Breadth of Discussion – up to 5 points
